This half term in Holly class, we have enjoyed reading two books in English and have written our own adapted stories based on 'Journey to J'burg 'and used Enid Blighton's, 'Famous Five' as inspiration for an adventure story. We have covered The Respiratory System within Science and the children loved looking at Earthquakes and Volcano in our unit on Plate Tectonics.
