# Cedar

2023 has started off well for Cedar class, having covered many topics and units of learning in a short space of time. In Maths, we have tackled tough bodies of work around Ratio and Algebra. As well, we have studied two rich fiction texts, *Goodnight Mr Tom* and *The Island*, both of which we explored in depth, and wrote our own alternative, descriptive and further captivating pieces of creative writing.

As well, we have continued a larger study across Science and Geography all about Climate change and Sustainability, taking into consideration the impact of the Carbon Cycle and our part to play in it. In Design Technology, we have









been conducting market research into Cakes and the amount of sugar content they have, and why it is important to consider this with regards to our health and diet. After conducting market research, we generated design criteria, calculated and sourced ingredients and then baked wonderful, delicious cakes in line with our brief and design criteria. We have continued our SATs preparation and we are cooking on gas! We have another round of mock SATs after half term, and are continuing to revise using the CGP homework books. Learning about the Ancient Greeks in History helped us to understand the history of the Olympic Games and its links to religious beliefs in Ancient Greece.










Our P.E unit on yoga facts involved learning how to do different poses and stretches, which we used to create our own sequences.

In PSHE, some life skills have been covered in our economic wellbeing unit, looking at ways to earn, spend and save money. Composing and creating were the theme in this terms music with Ms Lee channelling the classes love for Harry Potter to help them build a range of rhythms over a beat. Lastly, we have just completed a unit of PE on Yoga which has enabled the children to learn many 'jungle-related' poses and use them to tell their own stories through movement and poses.
