# School Prayer and Logo

Your children, may have told you that over the previous half term we have been asking them to create their own school prayers so that we have a prayer which is more personal to our school. Children were asked to make reference to 'Trees planted by streams of living water' and 'Flowing, Strengthening and Deepening'. We received over 100 prayers, all of which contributed to the overall feel and structure of a final collaborative piece of work which represents the whole school. In the case of some children's prayers we were able to use specific lines and many of the children have recognised their own words in the prayer, which is below:

Dear Lord

As you hold us in your hands, let us remember that each of us is like a leaf Growing from a tree firmly planted by streams of living water And together our school makes a mighty forest

Like a Holy Well, stood in stone, you build us up and teach us to build up one another

Please pour out your blessings upon our school Let your compassion flow through us When we fall, may your spirit strengthen us Deepen our love and let our love deepen in you.

All of this has inspired us to revisit the school logo, its symbolism and the children's understanding of what this means. After many drafts a proposed new logo has been designed which reflects 'Flowing, Strengthening and Deepening' - Linked to the water from the Holy Well, the new design also brings the idea of the 'Tree planted by streams of living water' to the fore. The logo has been shared with the children as well as the school governors and an image of it is copied below:



Hopefully the links between this and the new school prayer are clear, my thanks to Mrs Eddy for her work on the initial design and to Mr Oliver for the graphics work. Please note that the plan is not to replace existing school uniform but we do hope to use this logo on new branded items from September.

## Update from the governors
